



# Voting and COVID-19

---

- Counties can conduct mail ballot elections and expanded early voting for the General Election on November 3, 2020.
  - Ballots will be at the election administrator's office or other designated location from October 2, 2020 until the end of the election.
  - Counties should have AutoMARK™ or ExpressVote® available at polling locations from October 2, 2020 through election day. You should call your local county election office beforehand to make sure that they have a voting machine. You can also ask if they have curbside voter registration and/or voting.
  - Counties that conduct an early vote/mail ballot election will be sending mail ballots on October 9, 2020. The best option to maintain social distancing and avoid long lines on election day is to vote by mail.
  - If you are concerned that your mail ballot won't be delivered in time, drop your ballot off at your local county election office or use an alternative place of deposit. Any places of deposit will be listed in your mail ballot materials.
  - You can check your voter registration status and make any updates on Montana's Secretary of State's "My Voter Page" at <https://app.mt.gov/voterinfo/>. You will only be mailed a ballot if you are registered to vote before October 9, 2020.
  - If you need to vote in-person, go early in order to help you maintain social distancing and avoid long lines. This is a good way to protect your health and safety during COVID-19.
  - If you want to vote early, you should wait until you get your ballot in the mail. If you choose to go beforehand, you should call your local county election office first.
